According to courses descriptions templets

7-Program entry requirements according to faculty by law:

- Student must have the certificate of the recent high secondary school (scientific section) or an equal certificate in condition to be recent and that the English language is one of the languages that had been studied in the secondary level with a pass score not less than 75% with the exception for the language school graduates.
- o The Faculty accepts students who have graduated from the Technical and Health Institute (Nursing section) with new qualifications according to co-ordination office of the Egyptian Universities affiliated to the Supreme Council of Universities with a minimum score 75% of the total grades and those graduates will join the second year of the undergraduate program, around 10% from the total number of the students registered in the second year.

pass the standardized admission tests carried out by the Faculty after the approval of the Faculty Council.

- o Pass the medical checkup.
- o The Faculty accepts the students transferred from other nursing Faculties after reviewing the courses and made equation and the students take other subjects that did not meet the teaching hours according to the rules of the Faculty.
- Admission of students from other countries according to the Supreme Council of Universities laws.

8 - The rules governing the completion of the program:

- Nursing courses; (60%) are allocated for final written exam, (10%) for the oral exam, while (30%) for a semester work.
- Subjects that have a written and oral exam allocated (80%) for the writtenpart and (20%) for the oral part.
- o Subjects that have a written examination and a semester work grades are allocated (80%) for the written exam and (20%) for a semester work exam.
- o The percentage of success of the nursing and medical subjects (60%) and supporting subjects (50%) of the total score.

Exam system:

- o Examination system consists of two semesters and students attend exams in courses that finished at the end of the semester.
 - o The first semester exam is hold in January and the second semester examin May of each academic year according to university annual plan.
 - o A rewrite exam is hold in September of each year for only the fourth year only students who failed in not more than two courses only.
 - o Exams include written, oral, and practical according to faculty by law.

The requirements for the exam's entry: -

For the student to enter the final exam in any academic courses to have an attendance percentage in the practical training by not less than 75% according to the Supreme Council of Universities law. The Faculty Council at the request of competent Councils issues a decision to deny a student from taking the examination in courses that do not meet the attendance rate. In this case the student would fail the courses he/she was deprived of taking the examination

in. Where only if the student provides acceptable excuse for the faculty council. He/ she is considered absent with an acceptable excuse and thus retains his degree level in this subject. The student is derived from entering the final exam at the end of the semester for nursing subjects unless completed the minimum of success in the semester work and practical training at least (60%) of the total grades and he/ she must repeat the subject theoretically and practically in the following year and his success in this subject will be pass grade.
